





- Meetings Punctuality and Control. This has proven to be a most powerful tool in keeping interest in meetings, and high percentage attendance. Make sure to warmly welcome all visitors, and before closing the meeting thank them for attending. In the last edition of the Lion I referred members to various support material from LCI that can assist Club leaders with the task of running Club meetings.
- ♦ Give Lions tasks they will enjoy. One of the features of a Lions Club is the opportunity for us to make use of a very wide range of talents, skills and life experiences that Lions members bring into our organisation. We are wise to make good use of them.
- Show members you care. There is no better way to lose a member that to give up trying to keep them in the circle. Follow-ups on absenteeism are vital. Too many Lions in the past have resigned because of a resolve that their club didn't miss them, so they didn't need them.
- ♦ Keep in touch with members. This is really just an extension of the Club Care, and "we miss you" philosophy. These days we can keep in contact through email and other forms of social media.
- Don't allow an over-kill in fines and jokes. No one wants to be a spoil-sport or kill-joy, but control of the fines

session and stories is a vital aspect of member retention and possible recruitment.

- Involve all your members. People become Lions because they want to do something for their community. They want to help others, especially people who are disadvantaged, disabled or underprivileged. Whatever members' background or vocation they have something to offer to the overall success of the Club.
- Bond the Club together through good social activities. This is the key to success. It creates opportunities to get to really know people. The better we understand each other, the less chance of conflict. It creates harmony and good will.
- ◆ Be interested in people and acknowledge achievements. This all starts with good leadership, observant Bulletin Editor and observant Tail Twister and all with a lot of help from the whole club membership. The grape-vine has to work for this to have greatest effect and to make sure no-one is missed.
- Give thanks and praise when due. "Thank you," just two little words that mean so much.
- Deal promptly with conflicts. This speaks for itself and can off-set deeper problems later.




Congratulations to those clubs who have been selling Christmas cakes.

When our club charted in 2013, we were given a Donut machine that had been hidden away in the Lions Club store-rooms for many years.

The LEOS took this on as one of their first projects, cooking donuts at the community fair, in a tent. This was ok, but soon identified as a potential risk to members. The LEOS became well known for their donuts, being asked to attend school functions, community events etc.

It soon became evident, in order to provide a safe work environment for the LEOS, it was necessary to obtain a caravan. The LEOS purchased an old catering caravan from a nearby Lions club, but on closer inspection, it was found not to be structurally sound.

So, a conscious decision was made to fund raise specifically for a good quality catering caravan. The LEOS did this by catering for the Primary School Graduation, waiting at weddings etc, raising funds for their van.

The Uniting Church heard about their

The one stipulation that came from the community donations was that they did not purchase a second-hand van, but a new, purpose-built van.

Enough funds were raised to purchase the van in March 2019, a massive achievement for this young group and recognition form the community for their work. Since then, each month the LEOS rock up to work at the Cohuna Farmers & Makers Market, providing not only their now famous donuts but egg and bacon sandwiches, sausages in bread and drinks.

The van still required signwriting to complete it. This was achieved by a donation from the Cohuna Lions Club to cover the costs. This was completed in time for the first market held in November after the COVID 2020 lockdown. What a statement it made!!
