BENALLA LIONS CLUB



At our dinner meeting on April 15, long standing member, Bruce Walker, was our guest speaker. He spoke of his experiences when he worked in education at Pentridge Prison for 4 years from 1975 to 1978.

He explained how he came to have the opportunity, as primary school teacher, to work in his role at the prison. His first three years were mainly spent working in 'G'Division; the psychiatric section and he described how his role developed over time. One of his innovations was to conduct a running group that would have a daily run around small exercise yard

(21 laps to mile). One member of his running group escaped over the south wall in April, 1976. In absconding followed the route of another escapee who had done the same thing the previous day. The original escape method had been described in detail on the front page of 'The Sun' and this provided the a ready made plan the runner followed. He badly injured his ankle when he jumped from the top of the wall and was recaptured a few hundred metres away.

He also described other innovations such as a 'Discussion Group' where guests were invited to visit and talk to interested prisoners. This venture worked well but there were moments of drama which he shared. In 1978, Bruce became Principal of the Education Centre.

Lions members were able to ask questions at the end of the

talk.

He held many positions in the Club including Treasurer. Membership Chairman, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, 3rd Vice President and Tail Twister. number of years, Terry was Lion Tamer, whereby he looked after all the Lions regalia used at meetings.

Up until his health deteriorated, Terry only missed a handful of meetings in his eighteen years as a dedicated member.

At his funeral, Terry was buried wearing his favourite Lions Club polo shirt.

Yarrawonga Lions host Black Dog Institute - At the Lions Clubrooms, Lions and Lioness Members were joined by Dale Skinner, a volunteer Presenter with The Black Dog Institute. Dale gave an extremely enlightening presentation on mental health which also touched on his own diagnosis and the highs



and lows of this journey. Dale gave a description of the different types of mental illness, pointing out that they can indiscriminately affect anyone but with proper care they can be successfully managed. Dale has been a presenter with Black Dog Institute since 17th June, 2011, and has recently recorded a podcast called Dale's story, a link can be found on Black Dog Institute Website.

1 in 5 of us experience symptoms of mental illness in any given year In Australia, that is around 5 million people, and roughly 60% of these people will not seek help. The Black Dog Institute team is dedicated to understanding, preventing, and treating the significant mental health challenges that we face nationally and globally.

The Black Dog Institute addresses new challenges and opportunities in mental health – suicide prevention, digital innovation, lived experience, youth, and workplace mental health. Black Dog Institute is a proudly independent not-for profit medical research institute affiliated with UNSW Sydney.

Dale reminded everyone that there are lots of avenues for support and encouraged everyone that they are not alone and to reach out for themselves and their loved ones. Dale also reflected and shared a list of treatment options and resources.

MyLCI DATA CLEANSING **INFORMATION SHEET** FOR CLUB AND **CABINET** SECRETARIES

Sheet has Information The following prepared to assist each Club to undertake data cleansing exercise recently endorsed by the Council of Governors at the September Council meetina.

Over the next twelve months each Club has to finalised this review and standardise their Club MyLCI records with a view to dispensing with the PU101 in 2022 and the Multiple District Directory compiled from corrected Club MyLCI records.

Mobile and Telephone Numbers:

Based on the standards shown on line, mobile and telephone numbers should be listed as follows -

1. Home or Work No: currently listed as (02) 4823 6358 should be shown as

Country Code Area Code Number 61 2 4823 6358

2. Mobile No: currently listed as 0427 261 361 should be shown as -

Country Code Area Code Number 61 427 261 361

Address:

Please do not use abbreviations for Street or Road type and the entire address should preferably be in Capitals.

a. An address shown currently as 120 Green Valley Rd, Goulburn, NSW 2580 should be shown

Other Contact Information:

- i. It is imperative all contact information be as complete, up to date and accurate as possible unless the Lion involved indicates that some or all of the information is not for publication.
- ii. For example, if the Lion has an email address that can be listed, please show it (if is in agreeance), as that is generally how Lions Clubs International communicate with us.

iii. If the Lion has a mobile or home (or other) phone number that can be shown, include the number/s. For the purpose of future Directories, the default preferred phone number to be listed should be the Lions Mobile Number.

iv. Ultimately it is up to the individual Lion whether they adopt a separate Officer Correspondence Address from their home address. If they are been one and the same, remember to tick the check box under their personal address for correspondence.

Dates of Birth:

With the advent of full dates of birth at the beginning of 2019, most listed birthdays were incorrect because a default 1st January or 30th June date was added to the year of birth already in MyLCI.

The day and month of birth can be corrected at a Club level but if there is an error in the year of birth, that MUST be changed by Lions Clubs International.

When amending dates of birth ensure the check box "Date of Birth is confirmed" is ticked prior to saving.

Other MyLCI Club Information:

1. Club Information -

Club Information is found under My Lions Club Tab and then Club Info. Double check that the meeting venue, day / time are correctly listed. If meeting times and locations vary, or if one meeting is of a different type to other that month, ensure the correct information is shown.

2. Officer Information -

Found under My Lions Club Tab and then Officer Info. Please ensure that all appropriate officers for the current Lions year are listed e.g. President, Secretary, Treasurer, Administrator, Membership Chairperson, Vice President's and Address Line 1 City State (select from menu) Post Chairperson. If they are no listed access to this system will be declined.
