

BEECHWORTH BOOMERANG BAGS

With some funding from Beechworth Lions Club, and Beechworth Boomerang Bags Beechworth, Wangaratta, Kiewa/Tangambalanga, and Albury/Wodonga Boomerang Bags have decided to do another Toiletry Bag project to help our Victorian flooded towns. They have decided to start with Rochester (pop 3000) whose residents are similar number to Beechworth, and have set the number at 250 bags. This follows on from these Toiletry Bags with products given to Corryong Lions Club after the 2020 bush fires, and 500 bags taken to Lismore Lifeline Relief Centre in May this year by Lions Iris and Sven. These were all produced by these Boomerang Bag groups. Lions Iris is also Secretary of Beechworth Boomerang Bags and developed this project during the 2020 Bush Fires with the help of a lot of dedicated volunteers.

Also with funding given to Beechworth Lions Club from the 201V6 District Disaster Fund these Boomerang Bag groups are able to continue with a further 500 Toiletry Bags, to be passed onto Lion Paul Shortis, the V6 District Disaster Recovery Team chairperson.

For those that do not know the role of Boomerang Bag groups, its formation came from an idea, thought

up by two Queensland ladies to lessen the use of plastic bags and material taken to landfill. They are now groups in 15 countries in the world. Beechworth Boomerang Bags was formed in March 2017. Beechworth Lions Club has been a strong supporter of this group ever since they started. And this fire recovery project is one of the many projects they have assisted. Another great way of Lions working in the community in partnership.

The solar panels can then be installed, electrics finished, lining the walls, install the new kitchen, finish the toilet area, and then the internal painting.

Thank you Geoff Jackson Contracting, who is going to do the preparation for the landscaping.

The story of the dramas of this project I think will go down in history for the Beechworth Lions Club. Who would have thought that from an idea in July 2019 to save this building we would be still battling with this project. But as they say "Life was not meant to be easy", fingers crossed no more delays.

COHUNA CELEBRATES

Cohuna Lions Club has joined Lions Australia in celebrating 75 years' service to the community and also 60 years' service to their own community by installing a memorial garden. The garden also commemorates deceased members of Cohuna Lions Club.

The chosen site was a piece of waste land at the end of a local park. The land for the park had been donated to the community many years ago by a local stock agent, C.L.King, and is named in his honour.

This project required much planning and work for the Lions members; a grant was applied for, extensive





consultation with the Gannawarra Shire, advice and planning sought from a local nursery, assistance from local tradespeople and suppliers.

The plan was drawn up and plants purchased from the nursery and the plot was cleared of grass and weeds by the Lions members.

Wet weather caused continual interruptions and prolonged the project, but the Lions members pressed on, meeting twice a week in addition to their other weekly commitments at their wood-yard and delivering wood to the local residents

After many weeks of work and frustration with the weather the park started to take shape and the Lions could start to see the results of their hard work in transforming the area. Installation of edging, compost, gravel paths, low care and hardy plants and a watering system completed.

Finally, it was ready to be officially opened on the designated date, September 29th 2022. Invitations were extended to neighbouring Lions clubs, Lions Ladies, Gannawarra Shire Councillors and members of the community. P.D.G Norm Walkington, Zone Chairman Jeanette Cowan and project co-ordinator
